

Fat Transfer To Breasts Post-Operative Instructions

Sutures

The small stab incisions at the donor site are closed with dissolvable sutures, which do not require removal and will dissolvable over a period of approximately 7 to 14 days.

Dressings

The donor site is covered with a waterproof plaster, which can be removed after a week. There will be no dressings required on the recipient site as the fat is injected with a needle.

Medication

During your surgery I will use a long-acting local anaesthetic, but you may need additional analgesia in the form of Tylenol and Ibuprofen.

Scar advice

Once the dressings are removed, I recommend that you massage the incisions using small circular motions at least twice a day for 5 minutes. You can use any moisturising cream of your choice and apply firm pressure until it blanches.

The scars would also benefit from silicone scar gel (ScarAway® or Kelo-Cote®) twice a day, which will soften and fade the scars as well as applying sunblock for 12 months to provide sun protection.

The ScarAway® can be purchased from Healthcare Pharmacy at Governors Square in Grand Cayman.

Follow up

Before you are discharged from Hospital, you will be given a follow up appointment to see the nurse one week post-operatively.

I will normally see patients in clinic between 2 to 4 weeks following a procedure, depending on the type of surgery.

You should also be given contact numbers in the event of any problems. If you have any questions or concerns about your recovery, please do not hesitate to phone or email me and I will endeavour to respond to you the same day.
